

H Notch Construction

A Step by Step Guide



With the use of a jig (refer to GLL Construction Guide, page 6) and a circular saw, notches are cut into the log. For D shaped logs, the front cut, as viewed from the end of the log should be at a 7 degree angle, while the back cut remains vertical.

A series of kerfs are then cut between the front and the back cuts, as shown in the above photo.



NOTE: You will save a great deal of time by using 2 saws, one for the front cut and one for the back cut.



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Use a hammer or chisel to remove large pieces and a rasp to finish the kerfs on both sides of the notch.

The end result is a beautifully fitted H-Notch corner.
